Preparing your unit for Flea Treatment

Manitoba Housing will be treating your unit for fleas.

You must remain out of your unit for a minimum of 4 to 6 hours after treatment. It is recommended that persons with respiratory issues, pregnant women and newborns under 18 months of age remain out of the unit for 12 hours after treatment.

Prepare your unit as follows:

Kitchen:

- Clean countertops as well as the top of the fridge and stove completely, putting all food, dishes and cookware in kitchen cabinets, or sealed containers.
- Food inside the fridge and freezer does not need to be removed.

Living room, dining room, bedrooms, bathroom, storage areas and basements:

- Pull all furniture and other items 2 feet from the walls, leaving access to all baseboards.
- Remove all items from closet floors and place on higher shelves. These items can also be placed on top of a table in the unit and covered with a plastic sheet, towel, or blanket.
- Cover fish bowls, tanks, and aquariums and unplug the filter.
- Remove all other pets from your unit and keep them out at least 12 hours after treatment.

After treatment instructions:

- It is recommended that all pets be treated with flea shampoo to ensure the treatment of your unit is effective.
- Sweep or vacuum on a daily basis but do not wash the floors along the baseboards for at least 14 days.
- If mattress covers were installed during treatment, keep them on for the life of the mattress.
